Mrs Terry has secured a promotion as a Senior Science technician at another school after twenty years of service to our community. From our teaching staff, Mrs Clifton (English) and Mr Owen (DT) are relocating and Miss Southall (PE) has secured a Head of PE post. In addition, Mrs Hackett is leaving the Academy to retire after 34 years of service to the students of Branston Community Academy. Her work within the PE and Performing Arts departments has been transformative. We know that she has inspired many of our young people to pursue professions within education or the performing arts industry or even just to continue enjoying watching or performing in productions after they leave school. It has been an absolute pleasure to work alongside her for 25 of those years – our community will miss her greatly. We hope she enjoys a long and happy retirement.

Parent and Carer Engagement

It has been fantastic to get back to a full programme of face-to-face events this year. We have enjoyed a superb turnout for our parents' evenings with an average attendance of nearly 80%. This is back in-line with our pre-Covid figures and represented very positive attendance at these consultation evenings. These evenings give parents and carers an opportunity to speak to subject teachers, the SENDCO (Mrs Bayes-Green), pastoral leaders, student support staff and members of the leadership team. Often our Fairtrade student team are present to sell Fairtrade items. Next year all of our parents' evenings will continue to run face-to-face, except for our new tutor meeting for Years 8-11, which will run virtually.

Academy Site Developments

Students have adapted to the restrictions imposed due to the building works taking place at the moment. The upgrades to the site will continue over the summer and will be completed by November in most cases.

The dining room is being extended and having additional water points added as well. Students will also have a covered area where they can queue undercover if required. An additional oven is also being installed to help the canteen staff manage the volume of students using the facilities.

Room 14 in the DT block is being converted to a dual use room for Art and DT to accommodate the rising student numbers and demands for these subjects for GCSE and A'Level.

Finally, the swimming pool and sports hall are undergoing refurbishment, hopefully re-opening in November. The swimming pool and its surround are being completely refreshed. The sports hall will have a new floor laid and an overhaul of the inside. The outside of the whole building will be finished to tie in with the rest of the Academy – no more rusty corrugated iron!!

Edulink One

We will be changing the way we communicate with you. We will be retiring the SIMS Parent App, and migrating to the Edulink One product (Mobile app and/or website).

This system will be active for you when you receive an email from us, which contains your username and password. This email will go only to those who we have recorded as having 'parental responsibility'.

We are also moving all existing 'paper' based communications to this system, which will be become the only way of viewing this important information. It is therefore essential that you use this service.

Edulink One is a discreet, convenient, secure and reliable method which will enable us to send directly to you, information such as timetables, academic progress reports, achievements and behaviour updates, detentions, seasonal newsletters, emergency closures, examination entries/results and much more. We also use this system to collect your personal information that we need, and also that of your children that are studying here with us. This personal information can be updated whenever you wish, such as if you change your telephone number or address.

We have a 'noticeboard' area within Edulink One that has documents that you should find useful such as:

- Our Online Shop
- Our Biometrics Information
- Answers to frequently asked questions
- PE and DT policies and information
- Pre-loved uniform information



We use the Edulink One system to collect and

update your personal information, so we don't have to deal with paper-based forms. Please check and update your 'account information' as necessary, for yourself and any children as soon as you can. We especially need you to check and update any medical information and consent as discussed next. We rely on Edulink One to request an update for your consent for our fingerprint biometrics system we use for cashless catering. Prior to updating the biometric consent options, it is important that you look at the following documents on our website and also in the Edulink Noticeboard:

We also need you to update your consent for using photographs/videos of your children for school displays and publications and in our social feeds from time to time. We have lots of engagement with our community through our Academy Facebook page, and we love sharing some of the amazing work that goes on in the Academy such as in Food, Art and Science lessons, and also in our wider extra-curricular activities such as PE events, Duke of Edinburgh expeditions, and in the warmer months our 'Walk and Talk' wellbeing activities.

Yr8 STEM Challenge Day Bishop Grosseteste University



Design Technology and Science departments took a team of Year 8 students to this popular competition. Several Lincolnshire schools were represented, all hoping to make it through to the regional finals. The idea of the day is to raise enthusiasm for STEM subjects and encourage young people to consider studying them at College and University.

Branston students were put into teams with other schools for the various

challenges in order to promote team working. All students completed 3 out of 4 challenges on the day: robot programming, model electric car racing, e fit (criminal identification) and a medical diagnostics challenge. Points were awarded to the teams taking part for each of the activities and a winner declared at an award ceremony. Two of our students Hannah Riley and Heidi Pyburn made up 50% of the winning team and go on to the regional finals in January. Many congratulations to these two!



UKMT Maths Challenge

Over the past couple of terms our Gifted and Talented students from Years 8, 9 and 10 have been invited to take part in the annual Maths Challenges. These are papers of problem solving and logical thinking incorporating a wide variety of topics. In February, Years 9 and 10 completed the Intermediate Challenge. Students did this very successfully with six students gaining a silver award and eight a bronze. A particular mention goes to Ike Davids from Year 9 who achieved a gold award and the best score in the school.



United Kingdom Mathematics Trust

The Junior Maths Challenge took place in April with eighteen students from Year 8 taking part. Just like with the Intermediate Challenge students rose to the challenge resulting in three silver awards, six bronze awards and a gold award for Ruby Frost.

A level Maths Induction

There were plenty of enthusiastic mathematicians who joined us for A level maths induction this year. We spent an hour discovering some of the fundamental concepts of calculus using technology that would have saved Newton and Leibniz many hours of work back in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries.

After a short break we switched our attention to an engineering problem: how to build the tallest tower from spaghetti (uncooked!) and marshmallows. Tom Edgar and Nour Montasser's group worked diligently on a well-designed and complex structure but were beaten at the last minute by a more haphazard but taller construction from Gabbi's group.

Unfortunately, I think some of the groups fell victim to the heat of the day when the marshmallows melted and the towers collapsed.





Year 12 Work Experience



Year 12 Work Experience is embedded into our 6th Form curriculum - the aim being that students have the opportunity to try out their career ideas by completing a work experience placement that links with their future plans.

This proved to be an extremely valuable week with students making the most of the opportunities available to them. Our students are encouraged to find their own placement, and they have once again found some amazing opportunities. We had a range of employers offering work experience to our year 12 students including placements in IT, HR, Education, Retail, Finance/Accountancy, Office Administration, Law, Sports Coaching, Design and Engineering.

Students are encouraged to find their own placement so that it can be in an area of their choice, which links to their intended future career path thus allowing for the most fulfilling experience. Feedback from Students, Employers and Staff that contacted or visited students whilst on placement was, once again, excellent.

The skills learned and developed, during the week, along with the individual experiences will be invaluable to our students when making applications for university, apprenticeships and employment.



Lincolnshire Agricultural Show Schools challenge

We took 5 year 10 students and 3 year 8 Students to compete for the first time in the Lincolnshire Agricultural Show Schools challenge. Year 10 entered the Power of Water challenge, which looked at the different ways flood risks are managed sustainably. Year 8 looked at the History of Farming, which they focussed on the development of machinery.





The students worked really hard in making presentations and displays, and were able to engage with many members of the public and other school children. They also enjoyed some time visiting the Lincolnshire Show attractions.

The Royal Commission for the Great Exhibition of 1851 have sponsored Harry and he has been linked with a mentor from BAE Systems who will provide ongoing help and advice as Harry navigates a path to his career in engineering. Other benefits include regular enrichment events such as career conferences and a visit to Cambridge University's Chemical Engineering and Biotechnology departments. He will also recieve ongoing financial sponsorship to help enrich his studies.
