Students from across the years successfully performed the very challenging Shakespeare play The Merry Wives of Windsor as part of the National Shakespeare's School Festival. The students worked exceptionally hard to create a comical entertaining production which they performed at the Drill hall Lincoln on the 15th November to an enthusiastic audience of family and friends.

PROJECT X 2022

Project X returned after a 2-year covid absence this October/November. Project X is a STEM design and engineering challenge across Lincolnshire schools run by RAF

Waddington. The objective is to build a plane that can drop two separate survival packages (containing eggs) to stranded RAF personnel either side of a mountain without breaking.









The plane had to be designed to certain dimensions, be able to fly several missions and land safely. From when the group first met, they had about six weeks to design and build their aircraft. The first two weeks were about bringing ideas together, looking at previous planes to see what we could build in a few short lunch breaks. The team were given advice and support along the way by WO Mick Cranston and FS Mark Bailey to whom we owe a big thankyou!

Everyone pulled together with the plane build and testing of the packages (dropping out of the Science lab windows from the first floor) and after a bit of last-minute sticking, sawing, drilling and painting the plane was ready! The team arrived at RAF Waddington on the day of the challenge ready for action. The first challenge was the Dragons Den where the team were quizzed about there design and suitability for the task. After this they had several practice runs to help determine where the packages should be released so that they dropped on target.

The main competition runs were in the afternoon. We were up second and on both runs we hit the targets. Once the overall scoring was done, we unfortunately didn't make the cut for the 'fly off' which was eventually won by Sir William Robertson Academy.

Prizes were presented by Prince Edward, Earl of Wessex at the end of the day. During the visit he spent time speaking with the Branston team, quizzing them on their ideas and after a cheeky request signed our plane!





VALUES
